

Fig 1. Resightings and/or recaptures of individuals from three species of migratory shorebirds. All birds were banded in the Ralphs Bay area, including Lauderdale. Two species (red-necked stint [pink symbols] and curlew sandpiper [blue symbols]) migrate between breeding areas in northern Asia and non-breeding areas in Australia. Double-banded plovers [brown symbols] breed in New Zealand and migrate to southeast Australia, including Tasmania, for the winter months. 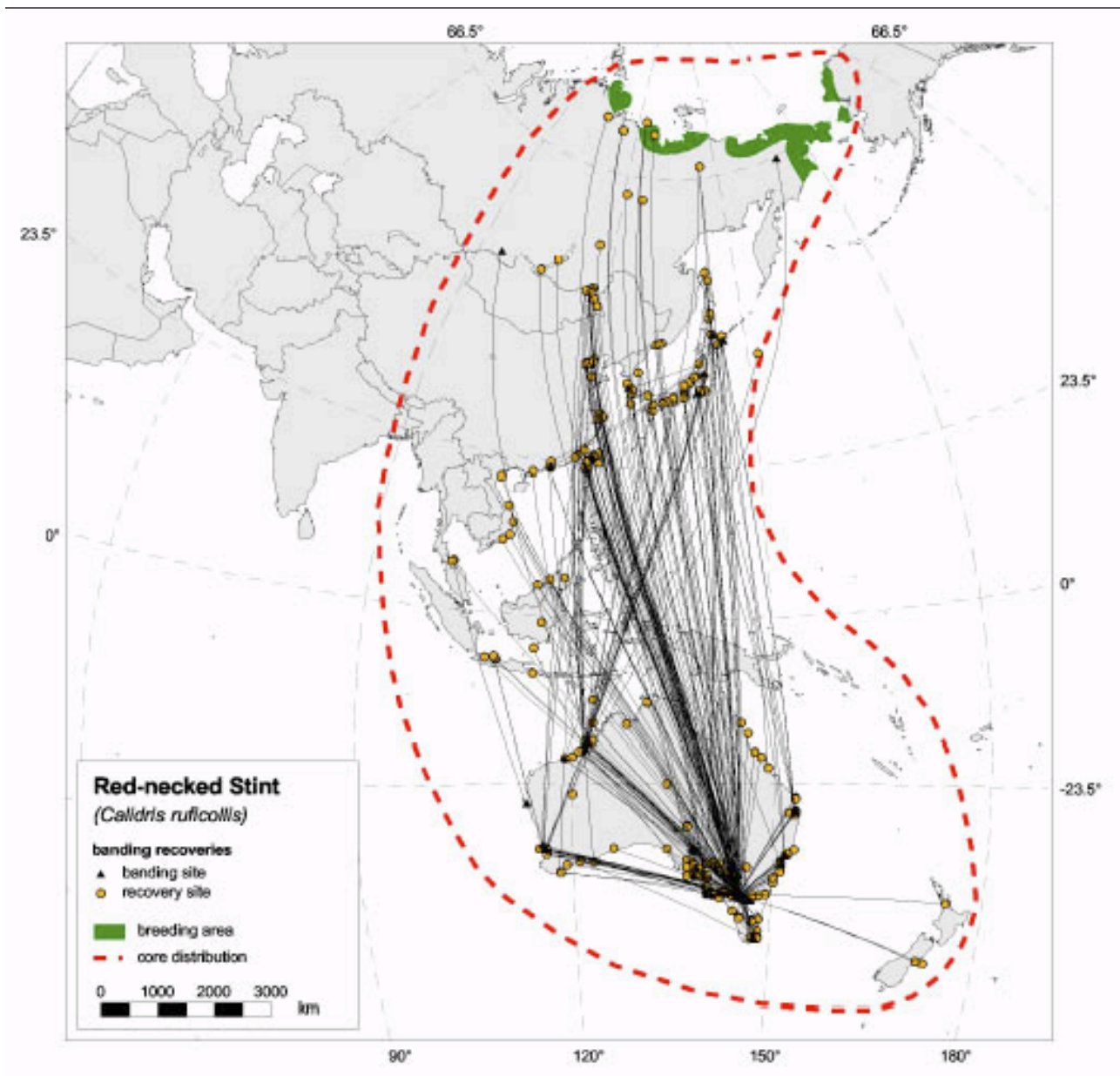


Fig 2. Map showing the movements and banding/recovery sites for red-necked stints in the East Asian-Australasian Flyway. © 2004 Birds Australia.

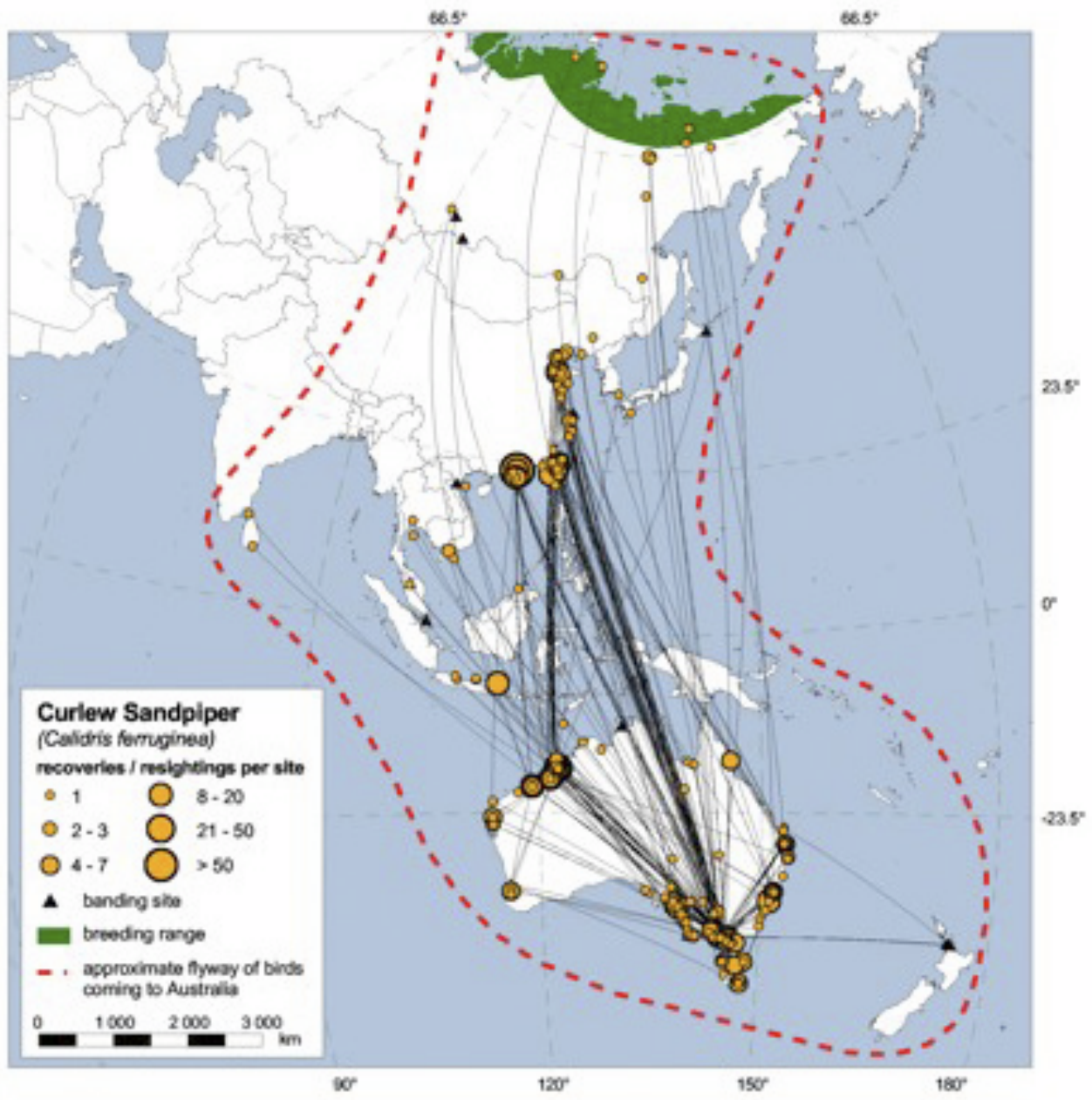


Fig 3. Map showing the movements and banding/recovery sites for curlew sandpipers in the East Asian-Australasian Flyway. © 2004 Birds Australia. © 2004 Birds Australia
